These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the City of Brooksville.

**REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS**

On or about July 29, 2025 the City of Brooksville will submit a request to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (FDEO) for the release of Community Development Block Grant funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development (HCD) Act of 1974, as amended, to undertake a project to Revitalize the Downtown CRA improved street right of way with street repaving, sidewalk repairs, fire hydrants and lighting along Broad Street, Main Street, Jefferson Street and adjacent streets.

**FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT**

The City of Brooksville has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file via the contact above at the City of Brooksville and may be examined or copied weekdays 9 A.M to 4 P.M.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the City of Brooksville to respond to comments). All comments must be received within 15 days following the posting date of this notice on the City website by July 28, 2025. Comments will be considered prior to the City of Brooksville requesting a release of funds. Comments should specify which notice they are addressing.

**RELEASE OF FUNDS**

The City of Brooksville certifies to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity and HUD that Christa G. Tanner in her capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The State's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Brooksville to use the CDBG funds.

**OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS**

DEO will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of Brooksville certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Brooksville; (b) the City

of Brooksville has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient has committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by the State; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures at 24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76 and shall be addressed to the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity, CDBG Program, MSC-400 107 East Madison Street, Tallahassee, FL 32399-6508. Potential objectors should contact the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
